Among local high schools McBride is in a unique position scholastically. The St. Louis public schools, the various county systems, and the private schools maintain comprehensive high schools. Of the large archdiocesan parish high schools, McBride has been designated for the past four years as the Major Learning high school for boys. Rosati-Kain fulfills a similar function for girls. All students at McBride follow the Track-A program of studies (required for graduation: twenty credits in English, social studies, mathematics, sciences, and languages; plus credits in religion, a fine art, a practical art, and physical education). Only those boys who choose this program and who qualify scholastically may come to McBride. To attract able students, many of whom must travel great distances, and to maintain high student morale in this demanding program, a strong public relations program—both within the school and public—wise—is needed. The Academic Honors Convocation can, we hope, serve such a dual purpose.

To give some permanent, prominent, and public form of recognition to academic excellence, the Academic Council of McBride High School decided last year to award a varsity chenille letter to students of outstanding merit. In the spring of 1960, ninety-six boys received these academic letters. This year, with the entire student body on the Track-A program, 188 boys have won this award. To earn a letter for academic excellence, a student must achieve the Academic Honor Roll every term for the first five terms of the current school year, OR must achieve Honor Roll rating four times while maintaining an overall point average of 3.0 or better. (Point average: A=4; B=3; C=2; D=1) A star distinguishes the letter of a student who has achieved Honor Roll rating every term AND who has maintained a point average of 3.5 or better.

In this printed program an attempt has been made to honor the award winners by listing their names, their academic achievements, and their achievements in academically allied activities.

Academic achievements include scholarships, fellowships, Curators certificates, Mathematics Honor Society certificates, the Association for the Promotion of the Study of Latin certificates, Mark Twain Summer School enrollment, outstanding performance in the voluntary Developmental Reading classes. Academically allied activities include those of a literary, musical, or dramatic nature.

A CURATORS CERTIFICATE of recognition as a student of high scholastic promise is awarded to seniors who rank in the upper 20th percentile of Missouri students in Missouri University's achievement testing program.

NEDT certificates for outstanding performance on the tenth-grade NATIONAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT TEST are granted to those sophomores who rank in the upper 25th percentile among tenth graders in the state of Missouri.

The MATHEMATICS HONOR SOCIETY (MHS) is an association of teachers of mathematics of the St. Louis Province of the Society of Mary (schools in Canada; Wisconsin; Illinois; Missouri; Texas; Lima, Peru) for the purpose of honoring students who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in the field of mathematics. An Honor Certificate is awarded each student who achieves a high level of performance on a standardized test (for example, the 99th percentile) in Algebra I, in Plane Geometry, in Algebra II, or in Trigonometry.

The ASSOCIATION FOR THE PROMOTION OF THE STUDY OF LATIN (APSL) on the basis of a nationwide examination, gives honors to those students who have demonstrated an exceptional achievement in the study of Latin. Scores are based on 120 points and awards are granted as follows:

- 1) Medal and certificate of superlative merit, summa cum laude: 115-120 points;
- 2) Certificate of eminent merit, maxima cum laude: 110-114 points;
- 3) Certificate of superior merit, magna cum laude: 100-109 points;
- 4) Certificate of honorable merit, cum laude: 90-99 points.

The MARK TWAIN SUMMER SCHOOL (MTSS) is a voluntary, non-credit summer school for academically talented students. Enrollment is limited. Students are screened and selected from among hundreds of applicants in St. Louis, St. Louis County, and surrounding communities in Missouri and Illinois. Students pursue courses according to their interests and proved abilities in academic areas ordinarily not available to them in their own schools' programs of studies or not pursuable in the students' crowded schedules during the regular school year. Courses open new areas of specialization. For the

1961 sessions, nineteen McBride students have been assigned places or have been named as alternates. Of these nineteen McBride students, eleven have merited the varsity chenille letter for academic excellence.

For those students who have achieved outstanding performance in the voluntary DEVELOPMENTAL READING CLASS, the reading rate (words per minute) on their final test is indicated in this printed program.

The CATHOLIC INTERSCHOLASTIC SPEECH LEAGUE (CISL) provides opportunities for Catholic students to compete in speech, debate, and oratorical endeavors of a wide range and depth. Trophies are awarded to schools with winning speech and debate teams; individual speakers merit pins, ribbons, and other symbols of excellence.

The NATIONAL CATHOLIC THEATER CONFERENCE (NCTC) is a national organization which promotes and rewards players and plays in the Catholic theater groups of the country. Members avail themselves not only of the fine experience and performances resultant from their participation, but they also have opportunities to win trophies, medals, and certificates of merit.
