by playing soccer and baseball for



Chib.




CHRIS SCHWEITZER

during the year.




PETE BUSALACCIUI


THOMAS KRAUS


DANIEL HEALY


JOHN SCHEUMBAUER

FRANK LORUSSO




JOHN BRUNNER

WILLIAM GAVIN .



LAWRENCE SIGNAIGO


Larry is a mamber of Epiphany Parish.


EUWARD BELLAMY

here at McBride.






Larry Signaigo, a Camra Club member, worked hard at developing the pictures for this yearbook. And Dennis Meier was an active member of the Vocation Club.


