RICHARD KONOPKA

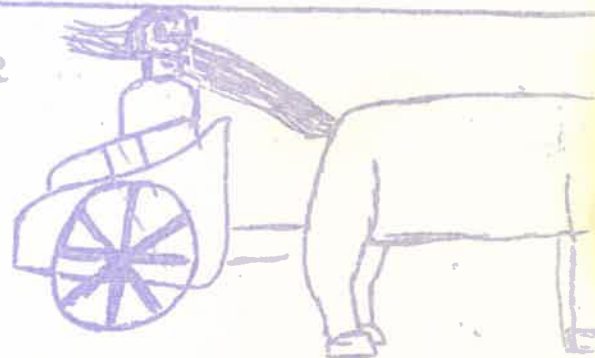

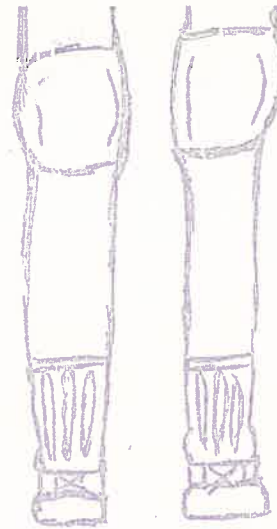

PETE BUSALACCHI

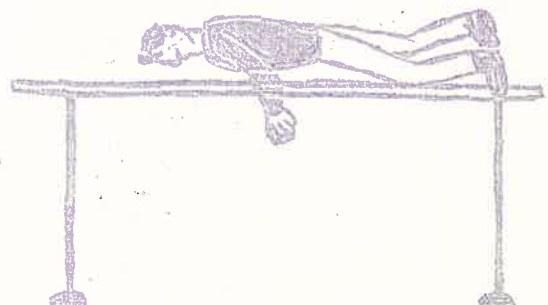

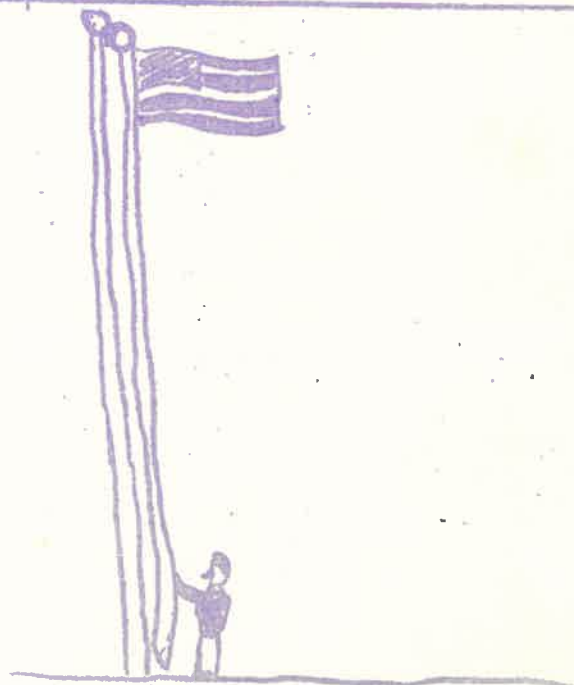

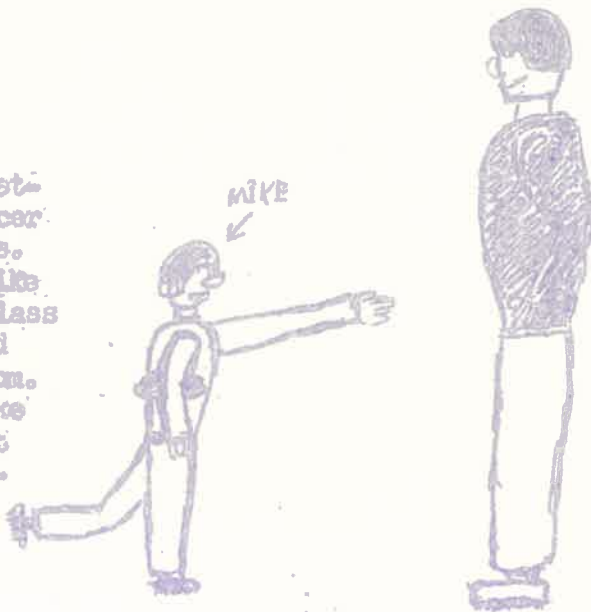
WILLIAM ROESELER

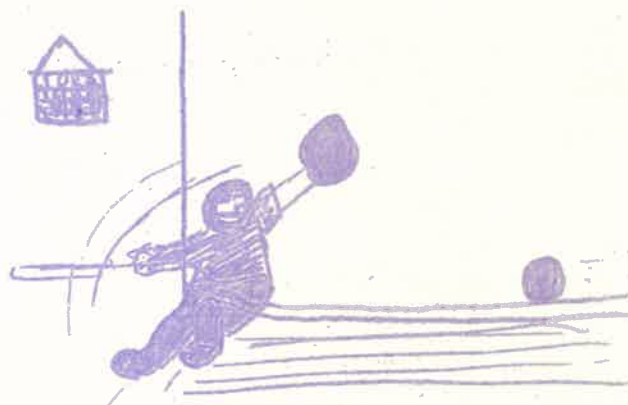
JOHN BRUNNER

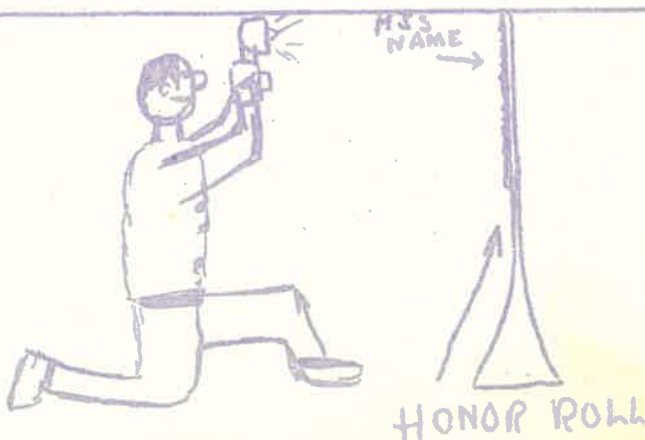
WILLIAM GAVIN

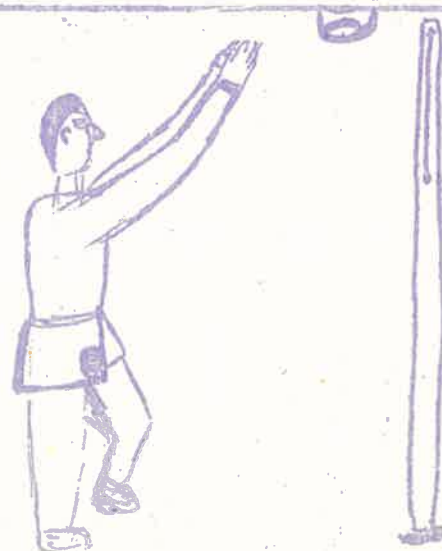
EDWARD BELLAMY
